## 1. GRADUATE FACULTY

The academic integrity of graduate programs rests primarily with the academic deans and the graduate faculty in the respective colleges. The main responsibilities of the members of the graduate faculty

## 2. INSTITUTIONAL CRITERIA FOR MEMBERSHIP ON THE GRADUATE FACULTY

Members of the graduate faculty ordinarily (a) possess a terminal degree in the teaching discipline or a related discipline from an institution accredited by a recognized accrediting agency, (b) demonstrate evidence of currency in the literature of the discipline, (c) are effective educators at the graduate level, and/or (d) are consistently active in scholarly and/or creative accomplishments. One or more of these criteria may be waived with approval of the dean in consultation with the Dean of Graduate Studies. Individual program le

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Scholarly and creative efforts include, but are not limited to, publications, performances, competitive, externally-funded contracts or grants, and presentations at scholarly conferences. For associate status, appropriate professional experience may be used in conjunction with or in lieu of scholarly and creative activities.

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## 5. EXCEPTIONS

Exceptions to this policy may be granted by the Dean of Graduate Studies in consultation with the Provost and Sr. Vice President for Academic Affairs.
